2. Interview process

Successful applicants will be invited to attend an interview with representation from Edge Hill University and Eatock Lead Partner. In preparation for the interview, candidates will be required to prepare a short 'about me' video with some information about themselves and why they want to become a teacher. Candidates are also required to undertake a mathematics task and a written English task as part of the recruitment process.

Once a decision has been made, candidates will be notified through the DfE Apply service.

3. School placements

All schools within our cluster are based in the Eatock lead partner alliance and applicants will be allocated a school based on their training compliance needs and address location.

During the PGCE Programme, trainees will undertake placements in both Key Stage One and Key Stage Two and typically build up to teaching 80% of the timetable by the end of their final placement.

4. Personal qualities

Trainees will need to have a love of learning and show commitment to developing their own knowledge and understanding of how children learn.
